Ronald Bayer is a Professor at the Columbia University School of Public Health. His interests centre on justice and health care, occupational health, and controversies in science and technology. He has written extensively on ethical and political controversies in medicine.

David E. Bloom is a Professor of Economics and former Chair of the Department of Economics at Columbia University. During 1995–96, he is serving as Executive Director of the Harvard Institute for International Development (HIID). Since 1991, he has been a member of the board of reviewing editors of the magazine *Science*.

Dwyer is the Chairman of the Department of Medicine at the Prince Henry/Prince of Wales Hospitals of the University of New South Wales and the Director of the AIDS Treatment and Research Center at those hospitals. In 1982, he started an AIDS Treatment and Research Center at Yale University. He is the founding President of the AIDS Society of Asia and the Pacific.

Sherry Glied is an Assistant Professor of Public Health and Economics at Columbia University and a faculty research fellow of the National Bureau of Economic Research in Cambridge, Massachusetts. She has done

extensive research on various aspects of the AIDS epidemic in both the US, and India.

Shiv Lal is the Additional Project Director and Technical Head at India's National AIDS Control Organization (NACO). He has served as the Director of the National Malaria Eradication Programme. He holds degrees in epidemiology and community health.

Ajay Mahal is a visiting professor of Economics at Barnard College. He holds a Ph D in Economics from Columbia University. His dissertation was on the economic impact of AIDS.

George Petersen is the World Health Organization's representative in Cambodia. He has also served as the Regional Adviser in Communicable Diseases at the WHO's Regional Office for the Western Pacific.

Rabin M. Sarda is the Acting Regional Adviser on AIDS and STD at the Western Pacific Office of the World Health Organization. He is responsible for WHO support and collaboration with national AIDS programmes in 35 countries in the Western Pacific.
