Ideal candidate should be a Ph.D. in agriculture or basic sciences, especially biological/chemical sciences with at least 12 years post doctoral research experience, as evidenced by research publications in reputed scientific journals. The candidate should be able to lead a team of qualified and dedicated scientists who are handling several funded projects and guiding research scholars for Ph.D. programme. Previous experience of working in plantation crops will be an added advantage. The candidate should be able to co-ordinate with governmental agencies such as Tea Board, CSIR, DBT, plantation companies and related industrial establishments for obtaining research grants as well as in the planning and execution of research projects.
