Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment (ATREE) is looking for dynamic, independent individuals to fill two Post-doctoral positions to pursue research in any area in the broad interdisciplinary subject of Conservation Science, from any of its locations.

The candidate should have earned a Ph.D. in either sciences or the humanities, within the last four years. We would prefer candidates who are interested in doing research on the linkages between climate change and the conservation of biodiversity. Research could be in social or natural sciences, but interdisciplinary research would be particularly encouraged. Candidates should have demonstrated research skills and have at least one peer-reviewed publication.

This position is for a fixed 2-year term with the requirement of submitting two journal publications at the end of this term. We will provide a consolidated fellowship of Rs 20,000 per month and a modest contingency grant.

ATREE (www.atree.org) is fast emerging as one of South Asia's leading conservation organizations. ATREE has a Ph.D. program housed at its new Academy for Conservation Science and Sustainability Studies and is recognized by the Manipal University. ATREE has a network of field sites in the Western Ghats with facilities for field research. ATREE fosters diversity and gender equity at the work place. Women and persons from underprivileged groups are especially encouraged to apply.
